Day 1 | Journey to Stonehenge and on to Plymouth

The performance then shifts to a series of fast and lively Irish reels with the introduction of the Celtic Steps Dance Troop followed by the waltz and energetic jig.

Day 6 | A Day on the Ring of Kerry

Day 7 | Off to Limerick, the Majestic Cliffs of Moher and Galway



Stop in Limerick and view St. Mary's Cathedral, the Treaty Stone and King John's Castle. Enjoy the IMAX-type multimedia which gives visitors a bird's eye view of the cliffs or dive virtually beneath the surface of the Atlantic and into the underwater caves at the foot of the cliffs that would have otherwise gone unseen. Your next overnight stop in Galway is a real treat for culture buffs. Ireland's capital of music, song and dance and it's the perfect place to dig deep into Ireland's vibrant traditional arts scene first-hand.




